The 6th Annual Live Aloha Hawaiian Cultural Festival celebrates the arts and culture of Hawaii in Seattle at the largest Hawaiian Festival in the Pacific Northwest. This FREE one-day event will take place at Seattle Center on Sunday, September 8, 2013 from 11am-7pm. Live Aloha is an annual event that celebrates our culture through the presentation of art, music, dance, crafts, workshops, exhibits and foods of Hawaii. We are anticipating an attendance of 15,000 people at the event.

This family-oriented cultural event is a great opportunity for Washington residents to experience the culture of Hawaii that is available to them right here in the Pacific Northwest. This festival provides excellent opportunities for children and adults of Washington State to celebrate the richness of the Hawaiian culture.

The Census Bureau estimates that there are 46,000 Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders in Washington State. Out of this number, 17,491 people migrated from Hawaii to the Greater Seattle area from 1995 to 2000. As the population of Hawaiians grows in Washington, so does the number of generations born here away from home.

The Live Aloha Hawaiian Cultural Festival is Washington State's premier Hawaiian cultural showcase, a celebration of Hawaii's music, dance and history intended to preserve and perpetuate the unique island traditions.

- Provide an interactive, hands-on cultural arts experience for families.
- Promote high quality performing, visual and literary artists.
